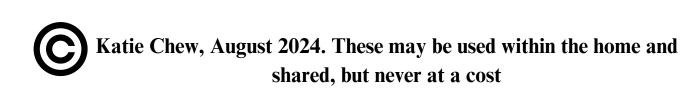
Bible Ballads Abraham and the Promise
