

BIG STORIES OF THE BIBLE 13 THE PASSOVER (EXODUS 12)

Scripture: Exodus 12:1-13, 14:13-31

Open: Greet, Praises, Requests, Pray

Supplies: Popsicles sticks, hot glue gun, red paint, blue streamers or pool noodles or bed sheets

Ask:

- Can anyone tell me some of the plagues we learned about last week?
- Today, we're going to talk about the final plague and how the Israelites left Egypt.

Read: Exodus 12:1-13

Explain:

God had given the Egyptians many chances to obey him, but they refused. This would be the plague that would cause Pharoah to let them go. But God was faithful to save his people. They needed to put the blood of a spotless lamb on their door to be passed over.

This points to Jesus. Jesus died on the cross and his blood was shed so that we can be passed over from the death we deserve due to our sin. He took our punishment upon himself to set us free, just like the blood of the lamb saved the Israelites and led to their freedom.

Craft:

Glue together popsicle sticks to create a door frame and paint it red.

Read: Exodus 14:13-31

Act it Out:

Using either streamers or pool noodles, have some of the kids in your class be the sea. Have someone be Moses and hold his staff over the sea and part it. Have the rest of the class walk through. You could also use bed sheets.

Comic Book Bibles:

Have the kids recreate the story of the Passover and the Exodus. Save it to add to their Comic Book Bibles.

Memorize: Exodus 14:31
