Paul (Also known as Saul) * Paul was known by different names in the Bible. His Jewish

- * Paul was a Hebrew from the tribe of Benjamin. (Philippians 3:5)
- * Paul was a Pharisee (Philippians 3:5-6)

name was Saul, but in Latin, it was Paul.

- * Paul began following Jesus after a vision that blinded him (Acts 9)
- * Paul was a citizen of Rome because he was born in the Roman province of Tarsus. (Acts 22:28)
- * Paul began the church in Philippi by teaching people there about Jesus. A woman named Lydia was one of these people that were part of the church in Philippi. (Act 1641-15)

Which character trait that you colored could you work on this week? Draw a picture of how you can act it out this week.


Do everything without grumbling or arguing, so that you may become blameless and pure, "children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation."

Then you will shine among them like stars in the sky as you hold firmly to the word of life.




Philippians:


