



PRESCHOOL A PILLOW AND A PROMISE

Young Reader's Bible: A Pillow and a Promise

Supplies: Rock for each kid, angel cut outs, paper ladder.

Main Point to Drive Home: God would fulfill his promise to Abraham through Jacob's descendants.

Open: Greet each child by name and play for three-five minutes

Song: (Optional) Sing a song from the boom box. If the kids are interested, create motions and invite them to dance and sing along.

Story Time:

Take the bigger kids into the story room (leaving the door open and using the gate). Have them choose a carpet square to sit on for the story. Before, have the kids go outside and each find one rock for our story today.

Explain: Last week, was Easter so we took a break from our story. Today, we're going to get back into the Bible where we left off. Before, Jacob tricked his father by putting fur on his arms and taking Esau's blessing. Today, we're going to find out what happens next.

Read "A Pillow and a Promise."

Explain: Even though Jacob did wrong, his brother forgave him. God also was faithful to his promise to Abraham to make him into a great nation. This would come through Jacob.

Craft:

Have the kids color angels to tape onto a ladder to remember Jacob's dream. If there is time and it is nice out, you can have them find rocks to create an altar like Jacob did.
