

PRESCHOOL THE KING WHO SANG PRAISES

Young Reader's Bible: The King Who Sang Praises

Supplies: Maracas that can be colored or another instrument craft. If you don't have the budget for a ready-made craft, consider paper plates with beans and staples or plastic cups filled with beans/beads and covered with plastic wrap and a rubber band.

Open: Greet each child by name and play for three-five minutes, go over the classroom rules.

Main Point to Drive Home: King David sang praises to God.

Story Time:

Take the bigger kids into the story room (leaving the door open and using the gate). Have them choose a carpet square to sit on for the story.

Review: Review the 10 Commandments up to what the kids know, add another if they're ready. Ask what they remember from the story last week. (They learned about David and Goliath). Ask: Does anyone know what it means to praise? (Allow for answers and explain it means to sing or cheer for God and all he does).

Read "The King Who Sang Praises"

Explain: God loves us so much and he is so great. David loved to praise him for who he is, and we can praise him too! Let's make an instrument and sing our own songs of praise to God.

Do a Craft:

Have the kids color the maracas. When they are finished, either teach them a Bible song you know, or have them sing their own song.
